Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment.



Louis Pinder – BMX Racing

Louis raced his first season ever in 2019 and then it all came to a grinding halt last year with lockdown. Overall in 2019, he finished in the South West 13th out of 30 riders in his age group, Male 10. There are 10 clubs in the South West Region covering Cornwall up to Llynfi in South Wales. They all travel around to each club and their position is worked out on the points they accumulate throughout their 10 Regionals. Each Regional consists of 3 motos and a final.

So far this year, Louis has raced 4 Regionals out of 10 and stands at 5th overall out of 18 riders so doing really well for his 2nd season. All the riders who are above him have been racing since they were very young so he's doing extremely well considering it's only his 2nd year. For the first time this year, he decided he would like to race at National level and we travelled to Kent Cyclopark last month. This is for all the top riders in the country and a very big event sponsored by HSBC.



Hannah Bond - Tetrathlon

The pony club selected Hannah to represent the South West at The Royal Windsor Horse Show doing tetrathlon, in July. Only 3 competitors from the South West were chosen to go! This was an amazing experience for Hannah.

Tetrathlon is shooting, swimming, running and riding. Hannah had two other team mates, one from Tiverton and one from Totnes. After the shoot, run, and swim, the team were in second place. They all had a brilliant ride on their ponies over a Show Jumping course and finished second with Scotland winning.

There were eight teams so Hannah felt extremely privileged to take part in such a prestigious event.
